I supposed there's little danger that `../../index.html` will cease working, though it's mildly inconvenient to go there first & be redirected to `../../root.cgi`. - There's an automatically generated "What's Newest" list.
- You can select articles by a simple keywords system. You can sort them by title, author, modification time, & creation time.
